CONTEXT

Thomas More College is a school with over 40 years of tradition and presence in the northern suburbs of Adelaide. It has a culture which requires all members of the College community to present themselves in a way which reflects the values and standards of the College. Necessarily, uniform places restriction on personal choice and requires consistency in presentation of all students.

PHILOSOPHY

Uniform and student presentation at Thomas More will be of a standard that brings pride and credit upon the school and be congruent with the high regard with which the College is held in the local community. Uniforms help students grow in a sense of communal identity, developing a commitment to the community and pride in both their school and personal appearance. Wearing a uniform with self-discipline and with dignity can assist in preparing students for the world beyond schooling where often, presentation is crucial in securing jobs. At all times, students are ambassadors of the school and are expected to wear the uniform in a way that presents a positive face of Thomas More College. As such students will need to avoid extreme trends and fashions, particularly with regard to hair, personal appearance and deportment.

PROCEDURE

All uniform items are available only through the College Uniform Shop (except shoes).

Uniform Shop hours:

Monday: 2:00pm – 4:00pm

Thursday: 2:00pm – 4:00pm

Friday: 8:00am – 10:00am

Other times or changes to the opening times will be advised in the College newsletter.

In wearing the College uniform, a student represents the whole College community. Behaviour while in uniform therefore reflects others - past and present students. The uniform is to be worn correctly and with pride. Behaviour is to be such that the whole College community can be proud of the way it is represented.

UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

SUMMER UNIFORM (Term 1 & 4)

Girls

1. College green and gold check dress worn at or below the knee. Alternatively, College grey trousers with white shirt, open neck, and College white cross logo.
2. Plain white, ribbed, knee-high socks
3. College green jumper

Boys

1. Short sleeve, white shirt with open neck and College logo
2. College Surrey shorts or College Surrey trousers
3. Plain black/grey marle socks with trousers or grey marle socks with shorts
4. College green jumper

WINTER UNIFORM (Term 2 & 3)

Girls

1. Long sleeve, white shirt with College logo
2. College green check skirt worn at or below the knee. Alternatively, College grey trousers, white shirt with College white cross logo
3. College plain black knee-high College socks or black full-length tights (70 Denier or more)
4. College green jumper (optional item)
5. College Green & Gold striped tie
6. College Blazer: Years 7 – 12

Boys

1. Long sleeve, white shirt with College logo
2. College Surrey trousers
3. College plain black/grey socks
4. College green jumper (optional item)
5. College Green & Gold striped tie
6. College Blazer: Years 7 – 12

All students in Years 7 - 12 are required to wear the College blazer to and from the College with the winter uniform. (Official Year 12 jumper may be worn in place of the blazer to and from the College when available). All students in Years 7-12 are also required to wear the blazer to assemblies, masses and at other times when requested by the College e.g. excursions.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION UNIFORM:

Years 7-12

1. Thomas More College charcoal shorts with white piping or Thomas More College charcoal tracksuit pants with white piping, with TMC icon logo in white with red underline
2. Thomas More College green polo top
3. Thomas More College green jacket, with white piping, and red internal collar, with College white cross logo
4. Thomas More College black or white sport socks with TMC icon logo in green or white sport socks Sandshoes
5. Thomas More College green hat with TMC icon logo in white with red underline

Year 10: Students may wear the Physical Education uniform only on the days they have a double lesson

Year 11 - 12: Students may wear the Physical Education uniform for two double lessons as communicated by their teacher.

The Physical Education uniform is not an alternative uniform to wear when something is wrong with the normal uniform.

OTHER UNIFORM ITEMS

1. Black leather low cut, low sole and low heel school shoes. In various specialist areas, for safety reasons, no sports shoes are accepted. (compulsory)
2. Thomas More College green hat with TMC icon logo in white with red underline – not to be worn during lesson time
3. Thomas More College Beanie – not to be worn during lesson time
4. Thomas More College bag (compulsory)
5. College green or plain black scarf (optional in Terms 2 and 3)
6. College green or plain black gloves (fingerless gloves not permitted)
